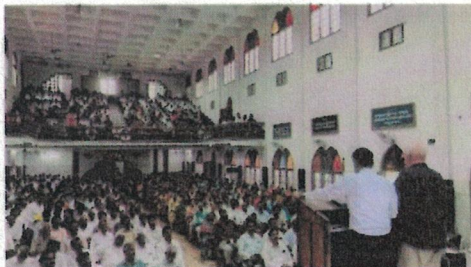

Greetings from the Churches of Christ, Rampachodavaram/Tuni areas of Andhra Pradesh and neighbouring states in India. We give thanks to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, for you with joy for your fellowship in the spreading of gospel. Your work of faith, labor of love has been bringing forth fruit in the most remote corners of rural Andhra Pradesh and beyond. We thank you for your generous support; hundreds of souls have turned away from idols and to serve the living and true God and hundreds of people have turned from their denominationalism and worshipping Him in the kingdom of His dear son. Thank you for being a vital part of His prosperous work in this part of the world.

Brethren, we are thrilled to share some marvellous news from our recent mission trip to India from November 4th to November 13th, 2025! Despite being a short journey, the impact it made was nothing short of extraordinary. Our team, consisting of Bro. Zachery Holmes, Bro. Glenn Holmes and Bro. Glenn Colley, worked tirelessly, determined to bring hope and encouragement to many, and we are elated to report on the many successes we achieved.

Over the course of our trip, we conducted an impressive 7 area tent meetings, reaching out to diverse communities of that entire area and sharing the message of love and faith. Our efforts



were met with tremendous enthusiasm, and we are overjoyed to announce that these meetings resulted in big numbers of baptisms! At Rampachodavaram, we baptised 82 people and at Siripuram we baptised 59 and at Narsipatnam, we

baptised 54 and so on. Our preaching brethren have worked tirelessly and invited people from their villages of preaching to attend these tent meetings. Though the circumstances at present to conduct such public gatherings are challenging and complicated, our preachers have made it possible. We have taken all the steps to ensure safety of our brethren but successfully reached many in and around that particular area. Thank you for your prayers.



In addition to our tent meetings, we visited 61 villages, each filled with unique stories and needs. We are extremely happy to report that we baptised 615 individuals during this short trip. Brethren, the dedication of our preaching brethren in serving these communities is truly remarkable. It is noteworthy that there were baptisms reported even before day our campaign began. The baptism pictures on page 3 showcase those that took place after the campaign, reflecting the tireless work and commitment of our team. None of this would have been possible without your continued support. Thank you so much for your love and encouragement; it is genuinely rewarding by our Lord.

We want to express our gratitude for our team's dedication during this campaign and their willingness to work tirelessly. They began their visits and preaching on the very day they arrived on the 5th, overcoming their jet lag, visiting 3 villages a day and actively participating in distribution of Bicycles, P.A. Systems (portable) and distribution of Sarees to widows as well as spending time with orphans. On November 7th, we conducted Bible Classes at Herald School at Kattamuru and also preached in the villages shifting from teaching classes and preaching in the villages. This exemplifies their commitment to serving the community and fulfilling their mission while in India. That same evening, we celebrated the graduation of 49 preacher students from the Herald School of Preaching, who were awarded diplomas for successfully completing their training. Then, on the evening of the 10th, we held a graduation ceremony for the Tuni School of Preaching, where 10 students received certificates of completion. These events not only

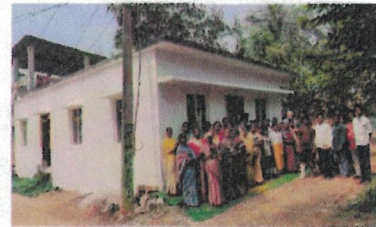


recognized the accomplishments of these dedicated students but also empowered them to share the Gospel and serve their communities, effectively multiplying the impact of our work.

Furthermore, we are happy to report that we dedicated 14 Church Buildings during this trip, all situated in different rural areas. We extend our heartfelt thanks to our brethren for their commitment to constructing these buildings, providing a space for worshipping Him in spirit and in truth. Previously, the members of these places had to worship in their house porches or



outdoors, often facing objections from their Hindu neighbourhood. The construction of church buildings is essential, especially in these challenging



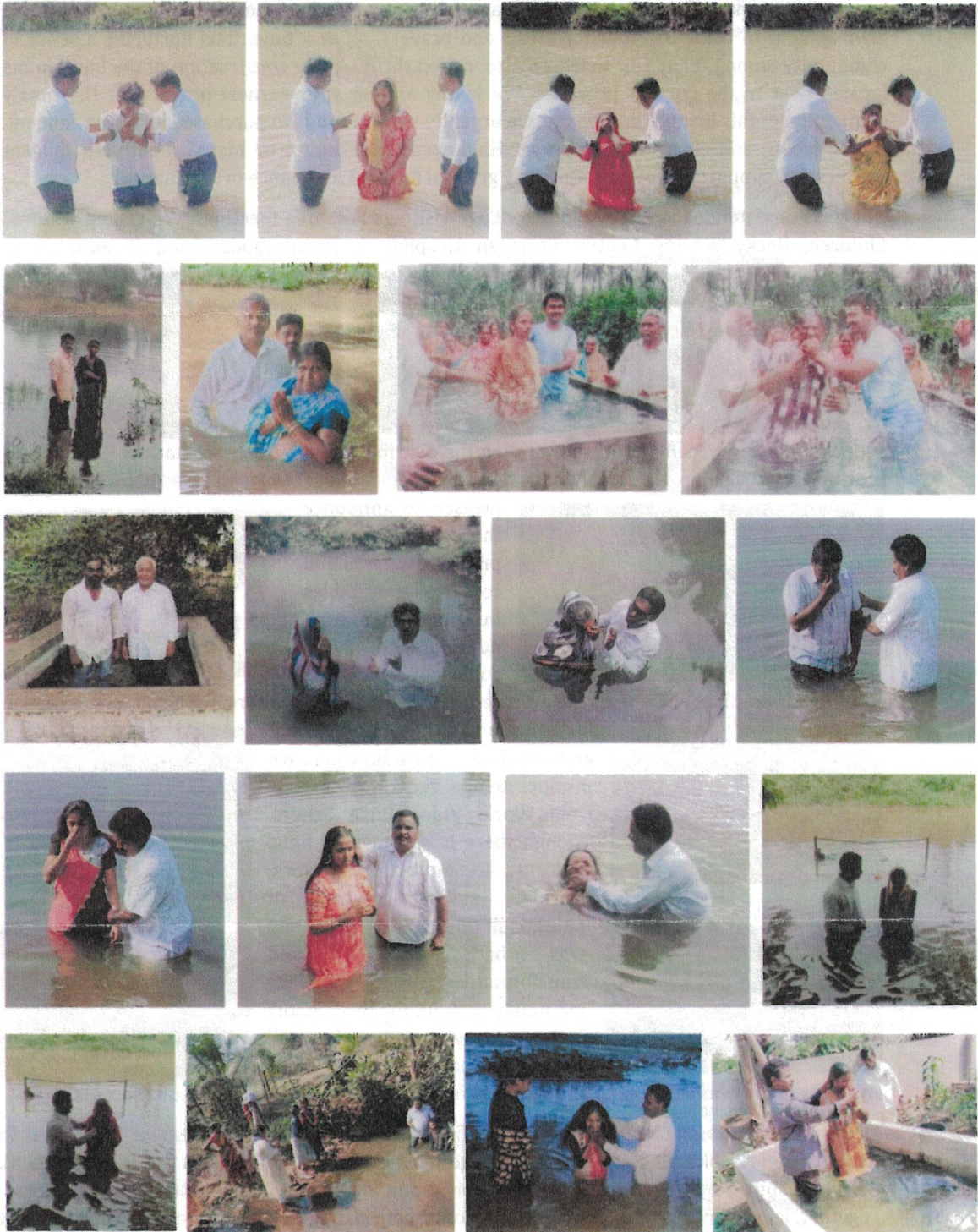
times, as the government and Hindu activists are working to impose bans on conversions and restricting permissions to permanently build buildings, even in rural areas. We sincerely appreciate your continued support in this important endeavour. Several church buildings are ready in other areas too, but we were unable to visit those locations during this brief trip.

It is with great delight we want to share that the children at Rampachodavaram have been provided with spacious facilities. Our brethren have officially dedicated a newly constructed Dining Hall and Kitchen. Furthermore, we have also built a generous Prayer Hall atop the Dining

Hall. Bro. Glenn Holmes had the honor of inaugurating the Dining Hall, while Bro. Zachery Holmes opened the Kitchen, and Bro. Glenn Colley unveiled the Prayer Hall for the children. This expansive facility serves as a significant blessing, offering the children a comfortable environment to come together for meals and prayers, all at a time, thus nurturing a sense of community among them. Our brethren also visited the on-going construction of the boys' home located next to the current premises. We kindly ask for your earnest prayers for the timely completion of this home. Additionally, we urgently require funds to purchase kitchen equipment, dining tables, and chairs for the Prayer Hall, needs that cannot be met without your diligent prayers and support. We remain sincerely grateful for your assistance in this matter.

Our mission extended well beyond the village visitings and area meetings. We visited widows, Children, Becky Sewing Center, Christian Hospital at Rampachodavaram, in addition to



supporting our preaching brethren through the distribution of 57 bicycles and 28 P.A. systems (portable). We also provided Holy Bibles and songbooks to everyone who was baptized. We are



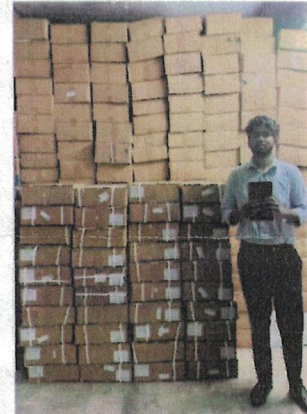
pleased to announce that we successfully procured 5,000 copies of Holy Bibles in Telugu and printed an additional 5,000 copies of songbooks



at Willette Graphics. Our team also visited Willette Graphics where we print our christian



literature and Telugu Bible School and our recording studio where we produce telugu version of lessons from World Video Bible School. Though there is shortage of time, we could accomplish much work, travelling several hundreds of miles. Our time in this short trip was both fulfilling and transformative, and we are incredibly grateful for the support and prayers we received from all of you back home. Your



encouragement was a source of strength that fuelled our efforts and ensured our success.

As we reflect on this incredible trip, we are filled with gratitude and excitement for what is to come. The work continues, and we are eager to see and do many more great things for our Lord. We too inspired by the many lives we touched and changed while meeting fellow brethren. Together, let us continue to support our mission, create lasting change, and spread hope where it is needed most. Thank you for being an essential part of this remarkable journey!
