Numerous widows are finding joy in life and experiencing good days while rejoicing in the Lord. Your support extends to hundreds of preachers, empowering them to face any persecution they may encounter while sharing the gospel. "For as the sufferings of Christ abound in us, so our consolation also abounds through Christ" (2 Cor. 1:5) Your compassion reaches even to those who do not yet know God. By providing aid, you are helping countless non-Christians address their physical ailments through the Christian hospital. Countless people came to know about one true God when they visited hospital and get treatment both in dental department and General treatments. Your commitment to advancing the work of the Lord in India is evident in the establishment of preaching schools, which equip hundreds of individuals to preach in their communities and support future generations. Additionally, you have set up printing press to produce Christian literature that conveys the truth of the Bible, as well as the Telugu Bible School (WVBS) that imparts knowledge of the Bible in the native language digitally. In addition, hundreds of church buildings in remote areas were constructed with the help of many churches, individuals and through memorial gifts; printed thousands of songbooks, and distributed thousands of Holy Bibles; provided P.A. systems and bicycles to the preaching brethren, and ignoring not the young widows, sewing machines were gifted to help them become self-sufficient after giving them proper training. Furthermore, many church buildings have been repaired, baptisteries built, and bore wells dug. We have also developed essential infrastructure for orphanages and homes for widows. It is estimated that currently, 350,000 Christians are worshipping regularly in the churches that you support, with approximately 1 million having embraced Christ through your diligent efforts. Your labor is not in vain in the Lord, "...God gave the increase. All glory to God."

Brethren, none of this would have been possible without your generous hearts and your dedication to the Lord's mission, which you pursue with zeal and enthusiasm. 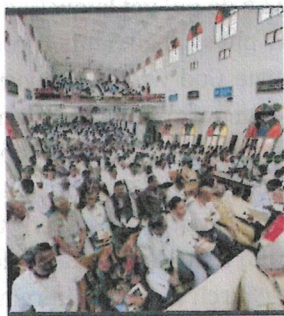

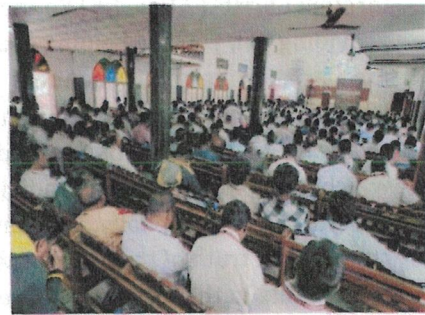

Preachers from various villages, towns gathered and the meeting was very successful. Most of



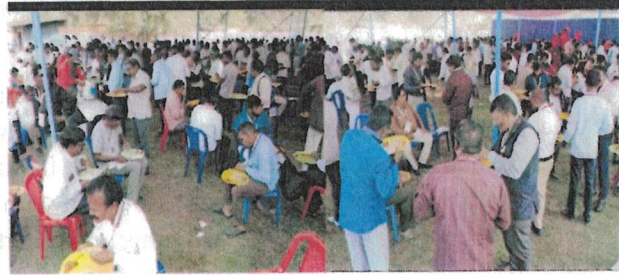
